# COUNTRY CREATIONS RULES & REGULATIONS

## Washington County Fair Association

**NOTICE:** All exhibitors and participants are cautioned to read carefully the following rules and regulations as same will be strictly enforced without deviation of any kind.

The Washington County Fair Association reserves to its Executive Board the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the Washington County Fair, and the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgement may determine. An exhibitor participant who violates any of the general, division, show or special rules as published in this catalog will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such.

Special rules or conditions are published in each division where necessary. If there is a conflict between any special rules or conditions of any division and the general rules and regulations, the special rules or conditions will prevail.

If any of the foregoing Rules or any provisions of any single Rule is later to be held legally invalid or otherwise unenforceable, all other Rules, and all other provisions and terms of any Rule containing a provision or term later held to be legally invalid or unenforceable, shall remain in full force and effect.

- 1. The Fair will officially open Saturday, September 10, 2011 at 6:00 p.m.** unless postponed by the Executive Board, which they hereby claim the right to do, either in part or whole, for cause whatsoever, for the general good of all concerned. The gates will open to visitors from 7:00 a.m. to 12 midnight.
- 2.** The Youth Department of the Washington County Fair Country Creations Division is open to any Washington County Youth in Kindergarten through Grade Twelve.
- 3.** The Adult Department of the Washington County Fair Country Creations Division is open to residents of Washington County. The Golden Age Department is open to residents in Washington County 65 years of age or older. Anyone 65 may elect to exhibit in the Adult Department.
- 4.** A \$2.00 entry fee per exhibitor will be assessed and must be paid prior to entering any items for show.
- 5. Articles must be made by the exhibitor and completed since the last fair. Articles exhibited at a previous Fair cannot be entered. VIOLATIONS MAY CAUSE THE EXHIBITOR TO FORFEIT ALL RIGHTS TO SHOW IN THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.**
- 6.** Business cards will not be attached to any articles exhibited.
- 7.** Only clean and undamaged articles will be accepted for exhibition.
- 8.** Exhibits are due on the specified date and time as listed in the Schedule of Events. **NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
- 9.** Entry cards should be completed **PRIOR** to delivering articles to the Country Creations for exhibition.

10. All articles shall be numbered by tag and/or label attached to the articles before being received by the chairperson in charge of the respective departments.
11. Only one article in each class of each department may be entered unless otherwise specified. Miscellaneous articles shall be items other than those already listed in the department classifications.
12. The committee chairperson has the right to refuse any item.
13. Each entry will receive a ribbon based on its own merit. Blue ribbon 90-100 points, Red ribbon 80-89 points and White ribbon 79 points and below.
14. The judges determine the ribbon worthiness of each item shown according to its own guidelines. The judge's critical analysis determines final placement.
15. Every effort will be made for the security of the exhibitors and others in attendance, but the Association will not be responsible for any articles broken, lost or stolen while on the grounds.
16. The Props committee makes the final decision regarding display of items, taking into consideration the safety and security of the exhibits.
17. All exhibited articles and/or premium money not picked up by 3:00 p.m. on the Sunday afternoon following the close of the fair will be forfeited to the Washington County Fair.
18. No claim for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, nor suit instituted or maintained against the Washington County Fair Association or its officers or agents, Washington County, Texas, by or on behalf of any person, firm or corporations, or their agents or representatives, servants or employees, having license or privileges to exhibit on the fairgrounds or occupy space thereon.
19. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$25.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be delivered to the management of the Washington County Fair Association immediately after the occasion for such protest. Protest will be accepted prior to judging or immediately at the conclusion of judging. Depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is complete.
- 20. ANY EXHIBITOR NOT ADHERING TO ANY RULE(S) OF THIS DIVISION MAY BE BANNED FROM THE COUNTRY CREATIONS DIVISION.**

## **ADULT AND GOLDEN AGE DEPARTMENT**

Baked Products, Canned Products, Machine Sewn Fabrics & Fibers, Creative Arts, Needlework, Quilt

**Adult:** Open to residents of Washington County.

**Golden Age:** Open to residents in Washington County 65 years of age or older. Anyone over age 65 may elect to exhibit as an Adult.

All ribbons will have the following premium values:

Blue - \$1.00 , Red - \$0.75, White - \$0.50.

Grand Champion - \$5.00, Reserve Champion - \$3.00.

Baked Department: Best of Class \$2.00

After judging a specific department the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue ribbon item in each age group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blue ribbon item. In case of a tie, the judge determines the winner.

**SPECIAL AWARDS** - High Premium Exhibitor: After judging, the adult with the highest premium value will be awarded the Overall High Premium Adult/Golden Age Exhibitor and receive a crystal bowl.

## **YOUTH DEPARTMENT**

Baked Products, Canned Products, Machine Sewn Fabrics & Fibers, Creative Arts, Needlework

**Open to any Washington County Youth in Kindergarten thru 12th Grade.**

**The Youth Department will be divided into three groups for judging these divisions. The three groups are Kindergarten - 3rd Grade; 4th - 8th Grade; and 9th - 12th Grade. School Art is a separate division, does not receive premium money and is grouped differently. Please refer to School Art for additional information on that division.**

All ribbons will have the following premium values:

Blue - \$1.00 , Red - \$0.75, White - \$0.50.

Grand Champion - \$5.00, Reserve Champion - \$3.00.

After judging a specific department, the judge awards the Grand Champion Rosette to the highest blue ribbon item in each age group. The Reserve Champion Rosette will be awarded to the second highest blue ribbon item. In case of a tie, the judge determines the winner.

**SPECIAL AWARDS - High Premium Exhibitor:** After judging, the youth with the highest premium value will be named the Overall High Premium Youth Exhibitor and be awarded a buckle.

- Potted exhibits should be trimmed and neat. Pots shall be clean and free of dead leaves and other matter. (Appropriate size saucer under each pot.)
- Blooming plant exhibits that are known for their blooms, should be in bloom.
- Hanging baskets should be ready for hanging.
- Containers should not be dripping.
- All plants should be free of infestation. Plants with visible infestations will be refused.
- No late entries will be accepted.
- Plants must be in possession of and grown by exhibitor at least six weeks prior to the Fair. Plants exhibited in previous Fair may not be entered.
- No spray or gloss will be permitted on any horticulture exhibit.
- Exhibitors are responsible for watering their plants throughout the Fair.
- Potted, & hanging baskets and specimens will be checked in on Monday, Sept. 12th 4:00p.m.-7:00p.m.
- Specimens ONLY can also be accepted Tuesday Sept. 13th 7:30a.m.-9:00a.m.

## RULES & REGULATIONS

### **No frozen or previously frozen food items will be accepted.**

- You must have an exhibitor number showing you have entered competition in the Country Creations Division. Rules and regulations of the exhibitors corresponding department will be followed with special rules for Baked Products
- Business cards or name cannot be attached to or stamped on articles to be sold.
- Exhibitors will be required to work in the Country Store. 2010 exhibitors will work based on last year's Country Store sales amounts:

New Exhibitors 2 hours

\$0.00 - \$100.00 2 hours

\$100.01 - \$200.00 4 hours

\$200.01 - \$300.00 6 hours

\$300.01 and over 8 hours

- If you cannot work, you may find a substitute to work in your place. If you do not work, you will be unable to sell items in the County Store the following year.
- See the schedule of events for check-in, checkout, opening and closing times.
- You may enter for sale those items listed in the official Fair catalog.
- Items must be handmade.
- Canned products are to have been prepared within the last year, under the same specification as for judging. Only standard canning jars may be used. Chipped jars, rusted lids and unsealed jars will not be accepted.
- The committee has the option to refuse unacceptable articles.
- Due to limited space only a reasonable amount of like items may be brought in for sale by exhibitor. Items may be replaced as sold.
- Baked items will be entered each day, 15 minutes before the Country Store opens.
- Sale items must have a Country Store sale tag attached with the following information:
  - A. Exhibitors name & number
  - B. Sale price
  - C. Name of item & number
- Sale items must be entered on the sale card in numeric order for use in the office.
- Numbers on the sale items and sale card must correspond.
- Items entered for sale will not be judged, receive a ribbon, or premium money.
- 10% of exhibitor's total sale will go to the Fair.

### **Checks will be mailed on or around November 1.**

- Uniform pricing will be enforced. Items must be tagged and priced. Items are to be priced in \$0.25 increments: example: \$1.00, \$1.25, \$1.50, \$1.75, etc.
- Although all precautions will be taken, the Washington County Fair Association will not be responsible for items lost or stolen. Payments will be made only on those items for which stubs were turned in.
